Thank you for the opportunity to review and submit comments on proposed amendments to Rule 1:38-3, which would exclude certain medical and related records from public access.

The New Jersey State Bar Association (NJSBA) wholeheartedly supports the proposal. We believe that medical, psychiatric, psychological and alcohol and drug dependence records, reports and evaluations are personal, sensitive documents that should be kept confidential and shielded from public access as proposed, unless a court orders otherwise. We note that this is already the case in family law matters related to child support, child custody and parenting time determinations, and the association believes it is appropriate to provide the same exclusion from public access in other matters as well.
