Court Updates

- Preliminary guidelines for how attorneys can navigate their ethical responsibilities to clients with the emergence of Al technology. The Judiciary also released a Statement of Principles regarding the integration of AI technologies in New Jersey courts.
- Attorneys and the public now have <u>online access</u> to the Judiciary's roster of approved parenting coordinators.
- Certified Attorneys whose certification terms are expiring in the year 2024 must file an application for recertification by March 11.
- Attorneys in family law dissolution matters will have access to the election file through the Judiciary.

Legislative Update

- <u>S2991 (Singleton)/A2351 (Mukherji)</u>–Allows equitable distribution in divorce proceedings where one of the parties dies prior to final judgement
- A5235 (Lampitt)/S3627 (Vitale)–Revises health insurance coverage requirements for treatment of infertility
- A3837 (Jaffer)/S2459 (Ruiz)-Requires state government entities to provide vital documents and translation services in the 15 most common non-English languages
- <u>A4723 (McKeon)/S2740 (Codey)</u>–Requires motor vehicle dealers to offer to delete personal information from the motor vehicle's computer system in certain situations
- <u>A4292 (Carter)/S2841 (Scutari)</u>–Raises the minimum amount of liability coverage for commercial motor vehicles and autocabs
