The state Supreme Court <u>adopted the term</u> "Special Adjudicator" to replace "Special Master." In attorney disciplinary proceedings, the term "Special Ethics Adjudicator" will now replace "Special Ethics Master."

American Civil Liberties Union of New Jersey v. County Prosecutors Association of New Jersey— Whether the County Prosecutors Association of New Jersey is a public agency required to disclose records pursuant to OPRA—Essex County

expungements, the Supreme Court announced expungement procedures that allow attorneys to appear, substitute or withdraw as counsel in expungement matters with the consent of the parties both without leave of court and the payment of fees.

The Judiciary revised and updated three <u>domestic</u> <u>violence brochures</u> that explain the entire domestic violence court process for both the plaintiff and the defendant.

Defendants can now <u>apply for *Madden* pro bono</u> <u>counsel</u> through a statewide form.

NJSBA President Speaks at Panel on Mental Illness in the Legal System

NJSBA President Timothy F. McGoughran joined a panel at Stockton University on the impact of mental illness on the courts and criminal justice system. McGoughran spoke about stress in the practice of law and how the NJSBA is improving attorney well-being through its <u>Member Assistance</u> <u>Program</u>, a 24-hour service that connects members and their families to counselors and a library of wellness resources. State Supreme Court Justice Lee A. Solomon moderated the panel.
