The Supreme Court Committee on Wellness in the Law wants to hear from legal professionals about barriers to wellness in the legal community. The first in a series of regional <u>listening sessions</u> will be held in person on April 16.

<u>Christa Robey and Maureen Reynolds v. SPARC</u> <u>Group, LLC</u> (claiming ascertainable loss under the Consumer Protection Act—Bergen County)

The Advisory Committee on Professional Ethics <u>clarified that rule RPC 4.2</u>, which prohibits lawyers from communicating with a person who is represented by counsel about the subject of the representation without the other lawyer's consent, does not apply to *pro se* lawyers.

Volunteer attorneys can now <u>earn additional CLE</u> <u>credits</u> for serving on District Ethics Committees, District Fee Arbitration Committees, the Disciplinary Review Board or the Advisory Committee on Judicial Conduct.



#### **Civil and Matrimonial Trial Moratorium Lifted in Passaic County**

The Supreme Court announced the long-awaited resumption of civil and matrimonial trials in the Passaic vicinage, after trials had been suspended since July over a lack of judges. The announcement followed the appointment of a dozen new Superior Court judges in late March, which dropped judicial vacancies in the state to the lowest rate since 2019. Vacancies, however, remain a persistent problem and continue to hamper operations in some counties. The Mercer Vicinage announced it will transfer certain dissolution FM cases to other counties due to its vacancy number. The NJSBA has been a vocal advocate for the Senate and Governor to approve more judges. Read the NJSBA's full statement on the Passaic vicinage here.



#### **Stockton University to Host Panel on Mental Illness in the Legal System**

State Supreme Court Justice Lee Solomon will join national and local experts on April 16 for an <u>online</u> <u>panel</u> about the impact of mental illness on the

#### **Legislation to Watch**

A4083 (Reynolds-Jackson)/S3009 (Turner)– Establishes the John R. Lewis Voter Empowerment Act of New Jersey to prohibit the authority to prescribe or maintain voting or elections policies and practices in ways that would unnecessarily deny or abridge the right to vote.

A3855 (Conaway)/S2964 (Zwicker)–Creates standards for independent bias auditing of automated employment decision tools, which includes a requirement for employers who elect to use an automated employment decision tool to undergo a bias audit. This includes testing the tool to assess its predicted compliance with the provisions of the Law Against Discrimination and any other applicable law relating to employment discrimination.

A4054 (Murphy)/S2993 (McKeon)–Prohibits motor vehicle liability insurance policies from restricting the full payment of recovery amounts under a covered person's policy.

<u>A3820 (Wimberly)/S2968 (McKnight)</u>–Requires the state Attorney General to revise law enforcement use of force policy; implements certain reforms.
