News and Notices from the Courts

- The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit is hosting an <u>essay contest</u> for fifth and sixth-grade classes focused on civics, citizenship and the concept of "We the People." View the <u>guidelines</u> for the contest.
- The Judiciary announced <u>Thomas F. Shebell, III</u> as the secretary for the District IX Fee Arbitration Committee covering Monmouth County.
- The state Supreme Court requests <u>public</u> <u>comment</u> on proposed amendments to Rule 5:22-2(a) that are intended to expedite motions to waive family jurisdiction in juvenile delinquency cases. Comments are due by Jan. 13, 2025.
- The Court adopted <u>amendments</u> to Rules 1: 18B-1 and 1: 18B-3 regarding the submission, retention and disclosure of annual judicial



Supreme Court and Appellate Decisions

- <u>Dionicio Rodriguez v. Shelbourne Spring, LLC</u> (<u>Union County and Statewide</u>)—The Court ruled that Hartford Underwriters Insurance Company had no duty to defend an electrical contractor from an employee's negligence lawsuit.
- <u>IMO A.D., an Alleged Incapacitated Person</u> (Sussex County and Statewide)—The Court found that a court-appointed attorney and temporary guardian for an alleged incapacitated person were not entitled to legal fees against an adult protective services provider.
- <u>Thurman Hogan vs. Volkswagen Group of</u> <u>America, Inc. (Cumberland County and</u> <u>Statewide)</u>—A case concerning the interpretation of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Warranty Act or

financial reporting statements.

- The IOLTA Fund of the Bar of New Jersey <u>announced</u> the names of New Jersey attorneys who are removed from the 2024 Ineligible List.
- The Board on Continuing Legal Education announced the attorneys reinstated from the <u>2024 CLE Ineligible List</u> and <u>In-House Counsel</u> <u>CLE Ineligible List</u>, along with the names deleted from the <u>2024 CLE Ineligible List</u> due to error.
- The Judiciary revised page four of the <u>Civil Case</u> <u>Information Statement</u> regarding affordable housing and Bard Implanted Port Catheter Products.


